

- The original Little Mermaid statue is on a rock by the waterside at the Langelinie promenade in Copenhagen, Denmark.
- The root of the word "mermaid" is "mere", which is old English for sea.
- The gemstone aquamarine is said to be made from the tears of mermaids.
- There are many types of mermaids- sirens, water nymphs, oceanids, merrows, morgens, ceasgs ("kee-asks"), selkies, and many more.
- Some mermaids have powers like telepathy, seeing the future, and hypnosis.
- The mermaids of Weeki Wachee Springs in Florida have been performing shows forthe public since 1947.

Guppy Goodies

Mermaid Lemonade

Ingredients:

Prepared lemonade- bottled, powdered, etc...

Sanding sugar (teal, green, purple)

Lemon, sliced for garnish

Water

Food coloring

Make ice by adding a few drops of food coloring to the water

in each slot in the ice tray

Freeze

Wet rim of glass and dip in sanding sugar

Add ice cubes to glass and pour in lemonade

Garnish rim with a slice of lemon





Oyster Shell Cookies

Ingredients:

48 Nilla Wafers

1 tub vanilla marshmallow

frosting

24 white Sixlets candy

Food coloring

Divide frosting into bowls based on the number of colors chosen Add 1-2 drops of food color at a time into each bowl until you reach the desired color, mixing well between drops

Spread a spoonful of frosting

onto the flat side of 24 of the Nilla Wafers

Place on Sixlet candy toward the front of each frosted cookie
Place another Nilla Wafer, flat side down, on top of the frosted cookie, pushing down at the back and letting the pearl be seen
