



THE WHALE SHARK









- Whale sharks are the largest fish on the planet.
- Whale sharks can reach 46 feet long and weigh 24,000 pounds!
- Like krill, sponges, and baleen whales, whale sharks are filter feeders. They pull plankton through their gills for most of their nourishment.
- Whale sharks have about 3,000 tiny teeth, but they do not use them to eat or chew.
- Even though they are sharks, whale sharks are considered harmless and called "gentle giants".
- It is believed that whale sharks have a lifespan of 100-150 years.
- Whale sharks are awfully slow swimmers, moving about 3 miles an hour. They also swim by moving their entire body back and forth instead of just their tails.
- A whale shark's mouth is at the front of its head instead of on the bottom side like other sharks.


Meet our friend Anna!

- The whale shark is the <u>LARGEST</u> of all fish.
- The whale shark has a <u>HUGE</u> mouth, which can reach up to 4 feet (1.4 meters) across.
- It is a SHARK; it is not a whale.
- Food is strained from the water through its GILLS.
- It has 300 rows of tiny teeth, which many scientists believe are used to hold whatever is scooped into the <u>MOUTH</u>.
- The whale shark is <u>OVOVIVIPAROUS</u>, meaning that the embryo is formed within eggs retained in the mother's womb.
- 7. It has gill RAKERS that are located at the rear of the mouth.
- 8. The SKIN of a whale shark can be as thick as 4 inches.
- The whale shark can be recognized by the two-toned pattern of light <u>SPOTS</u> on its dark back.
- 10. It has a WHITE underside.
