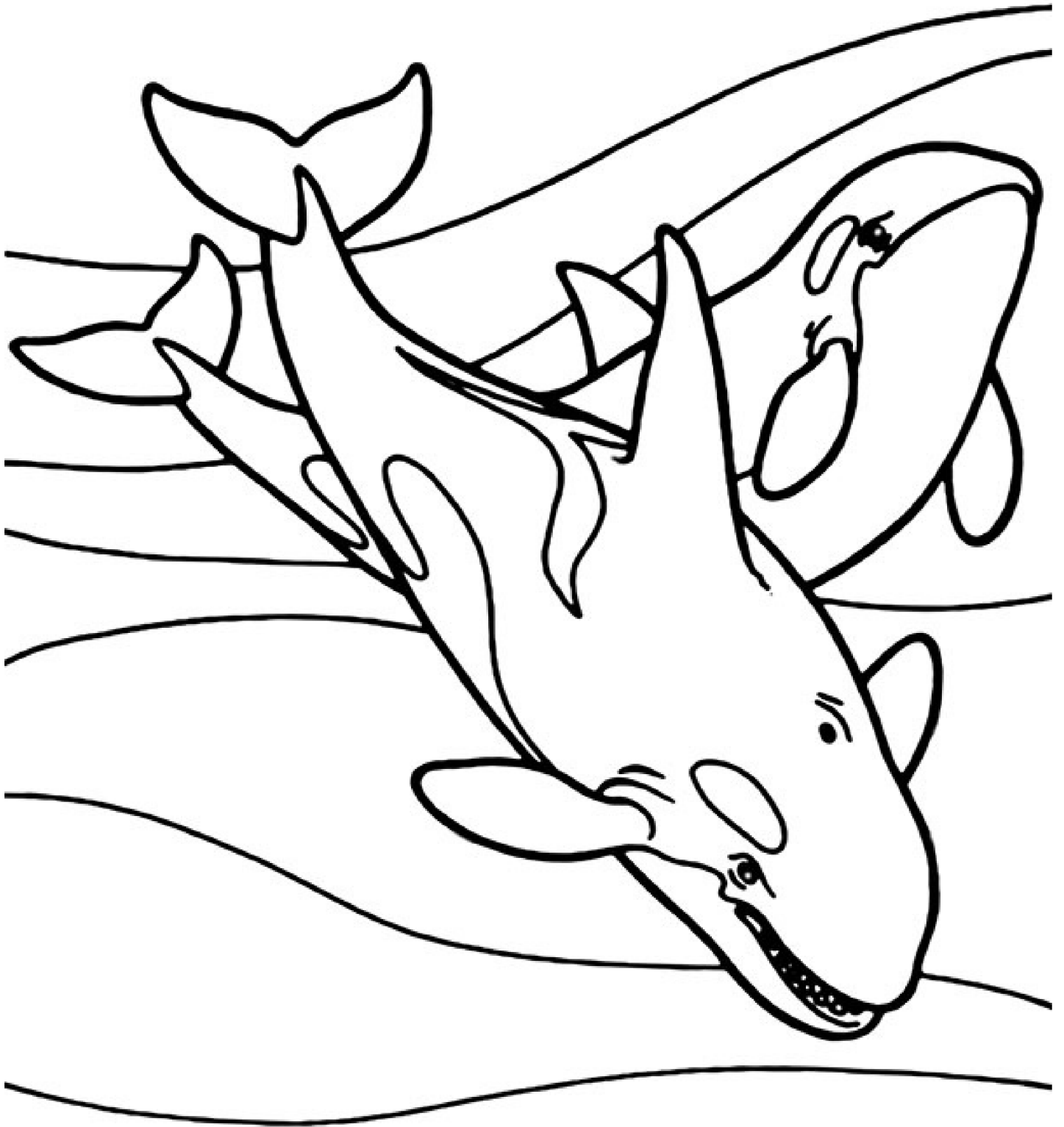

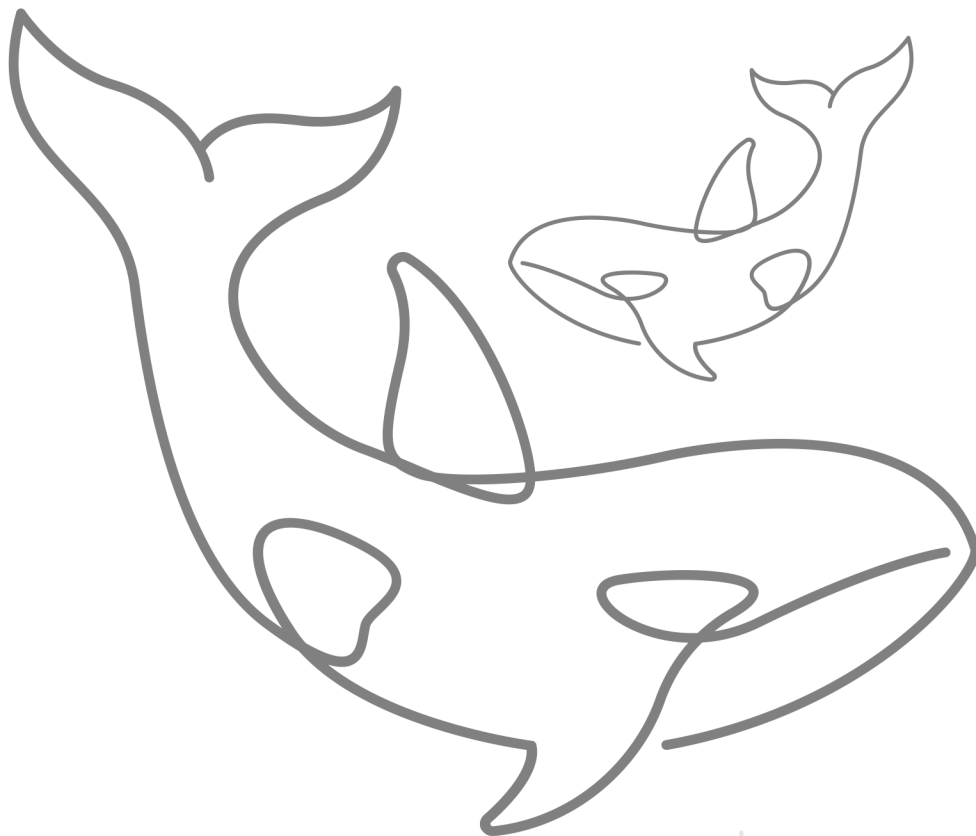


ORCAS!



- Even though they are called killer whales, orcas are not whales. They are actually the largest member of the dolphin family.
- Every orca has a unique grey marking behind their dorsal fin.
- Orcas are carnivorous and considered apex predators, meaning they are at the top of their food chain.
- A male orca is called a bull, a female is called a cow, and a baby orca is called a calf.
- Orcas live in all oceans and are found in most seas.
- In a single day an orca can easily travel 100 miles.
- Orcas are highly intelligent. They are one of the few species that are able to recognize themselves in a mirror.
- Orca pods are led by females.
- While orcas live to be up to about 80 years old, an orca named Granny is believed to have lived to be 105!

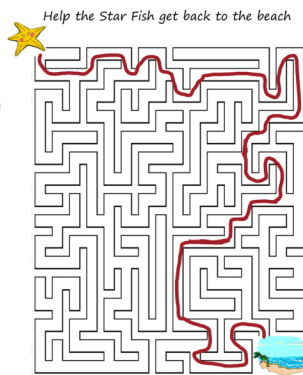

Guppy Goodies



Under the Sea Mermaid Honey Lime Fruit Salad

Ingredients

- ½ seedless watermelon
- ½ cantaloupe
- 2 cups green grapes
- 1 cup fresh blueberries
- 1 medium lime for 1 tablespoon lime juice and zest
- 3 tablespoons honey

Instructions

1. Slice watermelon into large round sections.
2. Cut out mermaid and sea shapes with cookie cutters.
3. Create cantaloupe balls using melon baller.
4. Add watermelon shapes, cantaloupe, grapes and blueberries to medium bowl.
5. Whisk together honey, 1 tablespoon lime juice and zest of lime.
6. Drizzle over fruit salad right before serving.
