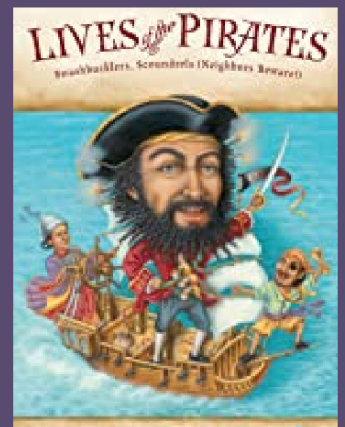

PIRATES!



- There were different types of pirates. Pirates were criminals who were known to attack and rob ships at sea. Privateers were pirates that worked with the permission of governments. Buccaneers were pirates that attacked coastal cities,
- The skull and crossbones flag at the top of a pirate ship is called a Jolly Roger.
- There were many well known pirates throughout the 16th and 17th centuries. Blackbeard (Edward Teach) was known for being a villain and harassing ships in the Caribbean. Benjamin Hornigold was a pirate, a privateer, and then a pirate hunter throughout his life. He was also a partner of Blackbeard. Henry Morgan was a buccaneer that was so brave and successful that his enemies even praised him. Sir Francis Drake was a naval commander and a privateer. Woodes Rogers was an English privateer that later became the governor of the Bahamas.
- Not all pirates were men. Anne Bonny became a pirate on Calico Jack Rackham's crew while her husband became an informant for Governor Woodes Rogers. Grace O'Malley was an Irish noblewoman who spent the majority of her life at sea. Cheng Shih took over her husband's pirate ship when he fell overboard and became the leader of the second largest pirate fleet in China.
- Because ships that pirates targeted were often transporting goods, the items they looted did not always include gold and silver. Most loot was foods, lumber, cloth, and animal hides.
- Each pirate ship had its own set of rules and codes. Everyone on board had to agree to the rules of the ship. These rules included how the loot would be split, what chores and jobs each person had, and even rules about fighting. Many ships did not allow fighting on board and anyone with disagreements would have to wait to be on land to fight.
- Pirates really did sing work songs called sea shanties. Sea shanties helped them keep time and coordinate movements in tasks like hauling ropes and hoisting sails.

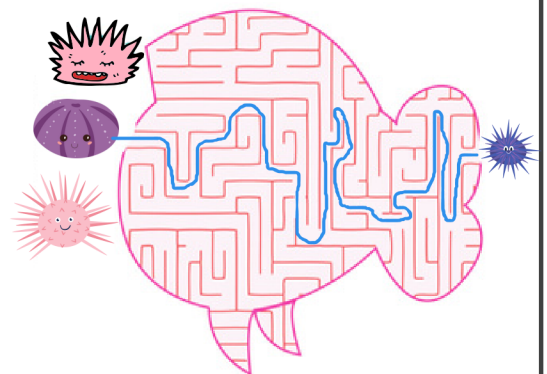

Guppy Goodies



Pirate Treasure Chests

Ingredients

- 1 pkg. Cocoa Krispies Treats
- 1 pkg. Rice Krispies Treats
- 2 Laffy Taffy Ropes, Banana Edible Food Writing Pen
- Candy for chests: Rock Candy, Jolly Ranchers, Gold Coins, Pearl Candy
- Plastic swords, for decoration

Directions

- Unwrap 2 Rice Krispies treats. Cut 1/3 off one of the treats for the top of the chest. Leave the other treat whole for the bottom of the chest. Cut the Laffy Taffy down the length of the rope so you have 3 equal sections.
- Take 2 pieces of the taffy and press onto the top of the chest, to look like 2 stripes. Take a tiny little square of taffy and press onto the front side to resemble a lock.
- Grab 2 small strips of the taffy and press onto the front side of the bottom of the chest. Line these up with the top stripes when the trunk is closed. Press a tiny little square of taffy on the front side to resemble a lock. With the writing pen, draw a little lock on each little square lock.
- Place a few pieces of each type of candy on top of the bottom chest and place the top piece of the chest on it. Make sure the back is pressed down to look like the chest is hinged, and the front is up to appear open.
