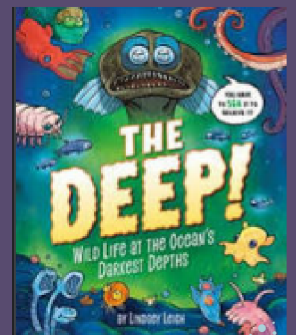

The Deep! Wildlife at the Ocean's Darkest Depths by Lindsey Leigh

Did you know that there are animals that are completely transparent? That some tube worms live for 1,000 years? That the Pigbutt Worm is also known as the "Flying Buttocks"? Or that there is a type of sea cucumber that is nicknamed "the headless chicken monster"? These are just some of the scientific facts, presented comics-style, that kids will pore over again and again.

The Deep! is a rollicking survey of animals that live in the deepest part of the ocean created in an exciting graphic nonfiction format. OCTOBER FIN FACTS WITH *Frostbit Fins* SPOOKY DEEP SEA CREATURES!



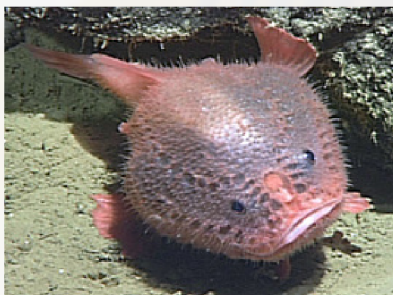
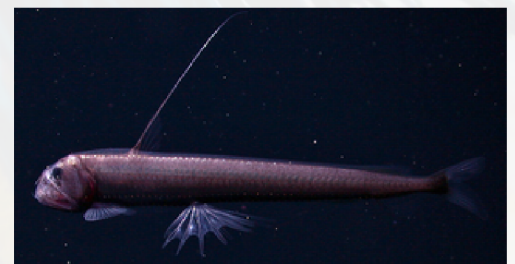
The **VAMPIRE SQUID** has huge, bright blue eyes- proportionally the largest in the animal kingdom, dark color, and a velvety, cloak-like webbing that connects its arms. These traits are what give the vampire squid its name.

Found mainly off the coast of Japan, the **GOBLIN SHARK** is easily recognizable by its pink color, long, narrow snout, and fang-like teeth that can be pulled back under their eyes or pushed out under its snout. Despite its scary looks, the goblin shark is not an aggressive species.



Female **ANGLERFISH** use a glowing appendage on their head like a fishing lure to hunt. They can also extend their jaw wide enough to eat a fish twice its size

VIPERFISH are one of the fiercest predators in the deep ocean. They have photophores, a light emitting organ, on their sides that help conceal it in the dark. The Sloanes viperfish is probably the scariest of all. Its fang- like teeth are more than half the size of its head, allowing them to impale prey by swimming at them head first with their mouths open.



COFFINFISH are very large and slow fish that "walk" along the sea floor using their pectoral fins. They are able to inflate their bodies to appear bigger and scare off predators.



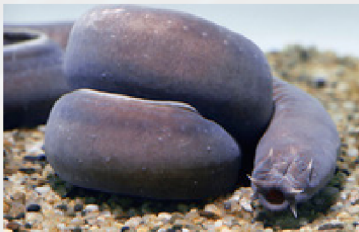
LAMPREY are tubular fish that do not have jaws. Instead, they have a suction-cup like mouth with circular rows of teeth. They use their mouths to grab onto other fish in order to feed on their blood.

FANGTOOTH FISH have the largest teeth compared to body size of any known fish. Their teeth are so big that they have to have special pouches on the roof of their mouth so they can close their mouths without their teeth going into their brains.



ZOMBIE WORMS don't eat brains... they eat bones! Without mouths or stomachs, zombie worms secrete acid to dissolve whale bones, then bacteria to break down collagen and fat. They absorb all of the nutrients that remain.

Are black **DRAGONFISH** able to become invisible?! No! They have transparent teeth and dark bodies which make them very hard to see in the deep, dark ocean. Like the viperfish they have photophores. The light is barely visible to the human eye, but is perfect for luring prey.



HAGFISH are eel-shaped, slime-producing fish that have a very scary way of eating. They eat their prey from the inside out.

The **GHOST SHRIMP** can survive without oxygen for as long as 6 days. The only thing spooky about ghost shrimp is their name. They share their burrows with other small invertebrates like pea crabs.



WOLF EELS are not truly eels but are long skinny fish. They lack a swim bladder, so cannot hover in the water- they have to swim to stay off the bottom.

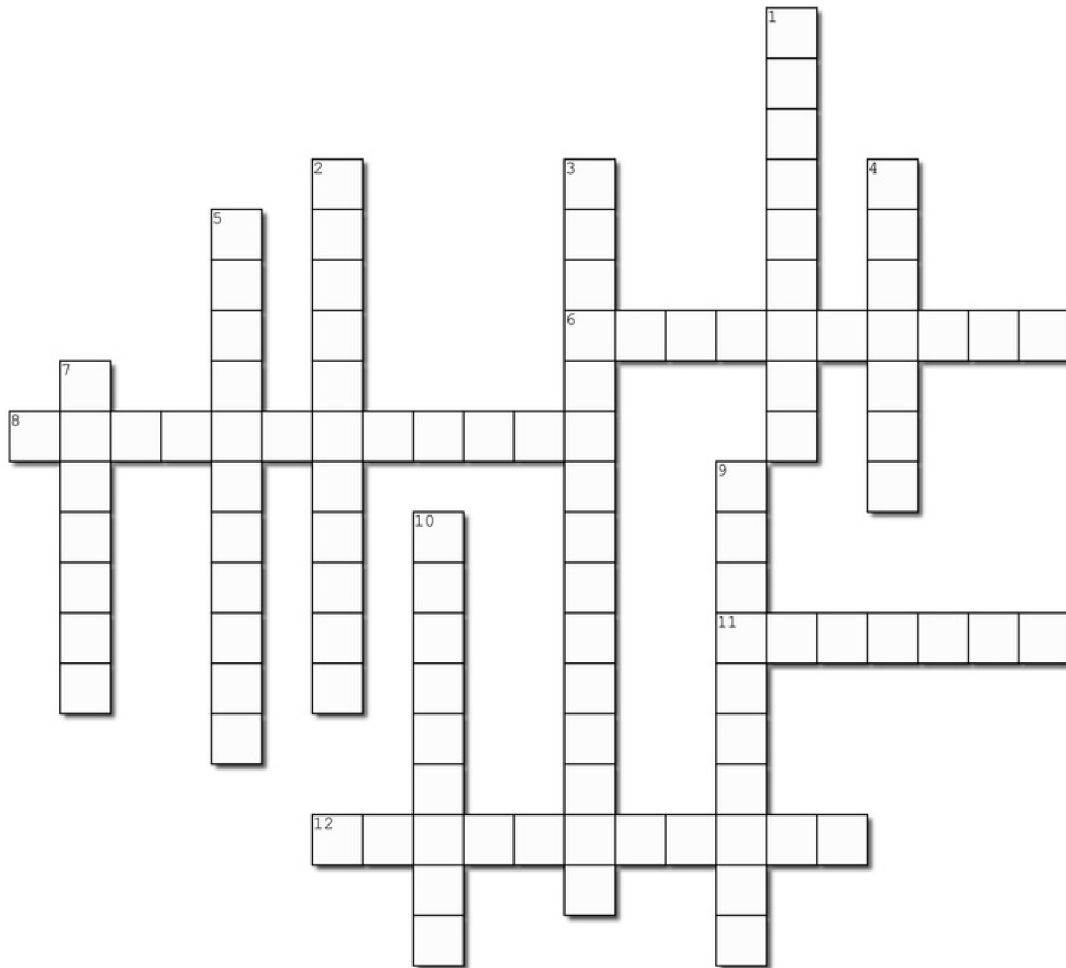

Across

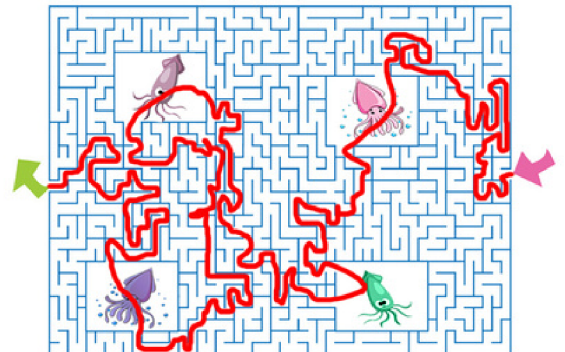
