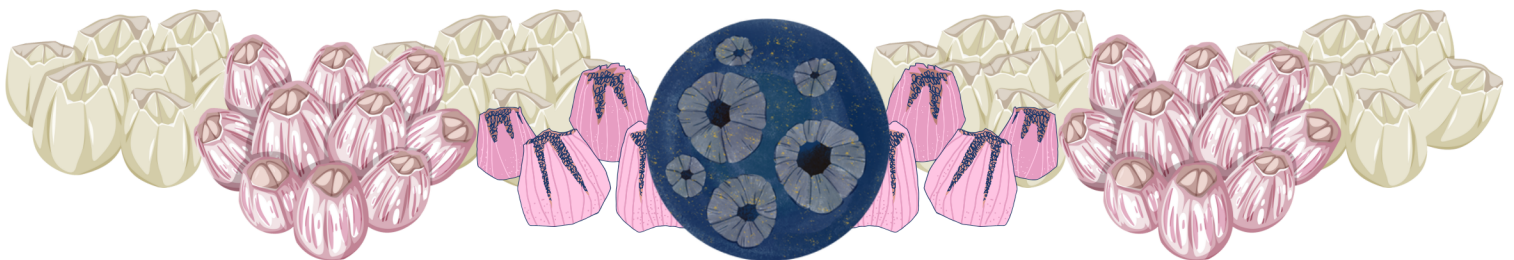

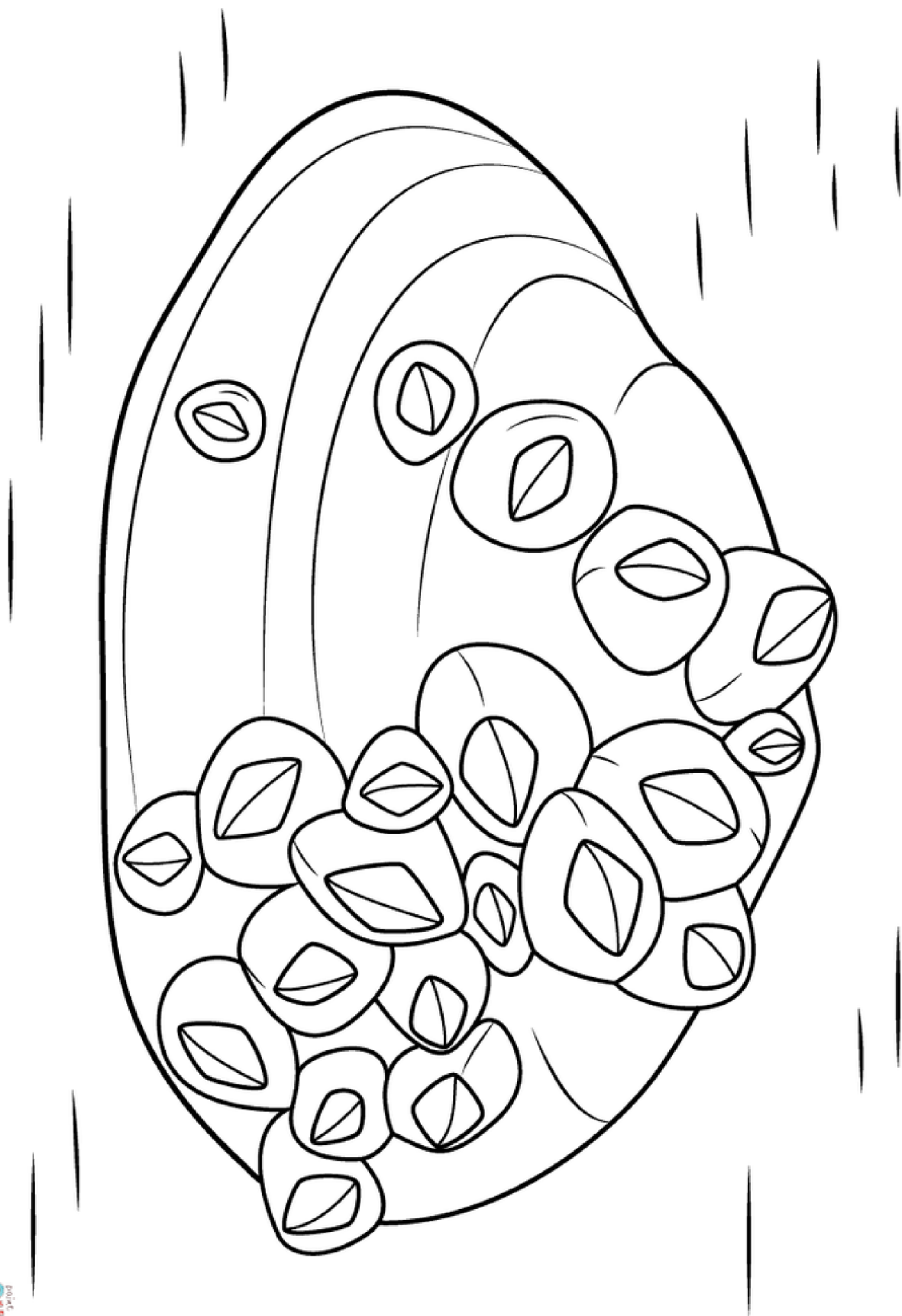


# \*December Fin Facts\*

## Barnacles!



- Barnacles are a kind of crustacean. It is covered in hard plates of calcium carbonate.
- Barnacles can be found attached to the bottoms of boats, dock posts, shoreline rocks, and other submerged surfaces. Along with those surfaces, they can also be found on the bodies of whales, turtles, manatees, and other sea creatures.
- There are more than 1000 species of barnacles living in shallow and tidal waters around the world.
- Barnacles swim for only a short time and then spend the rest of their lives attached to a hard surfaces.
- Barnacles vary in color. They can be found in colors like white, gray, yellow, pink, green, and brown.
- Special organs on the barnacle's legs, called Cirri help them hunt plankton and algae to gather nutrition.
- Barnacles do not have an actual heart. An esophageal sinus takes on the job of pumping blood through its body.
- Along with hunting and gathering, a barnacle's legs have another very important job. Barnacles absorb oxygen (or breathe) through their legs.
- Barnacles stick themselves to surfaces and sea creatures by secreting a fast-curing cement. This cement is among the most powerful natural glues known to man. It is so strong that researchers are trying to figure out how it can be used commercially.

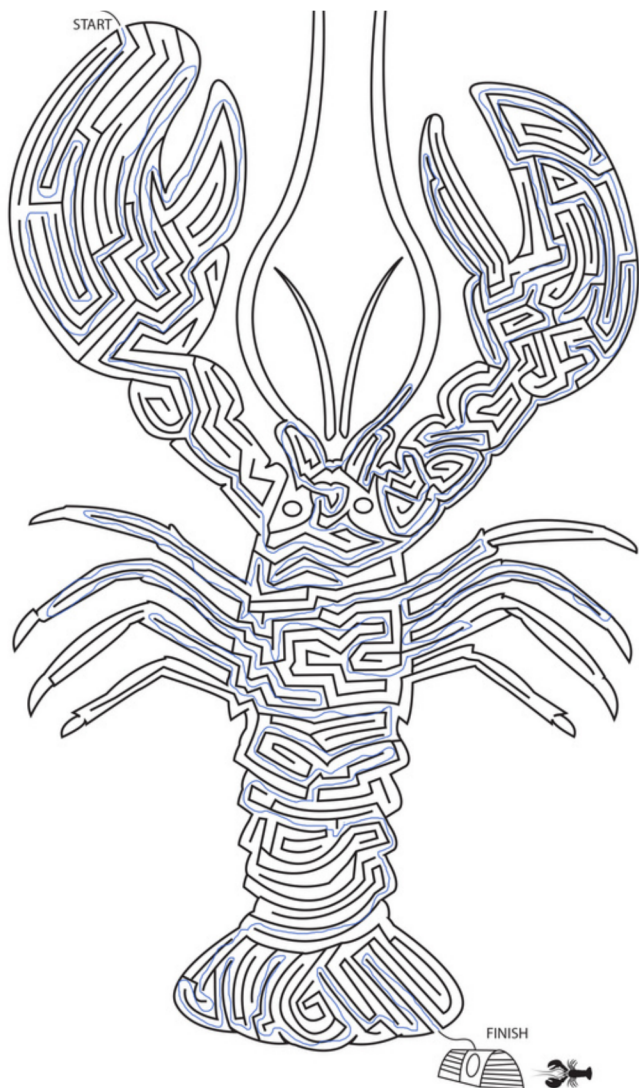
